## Catholic Charities Opens Farm Worker Housing Community


Arcadia—It was eight years in the making but the opening of the \$10 million Casa San Juan Bosco farm worker community was a joyful celebration held on January 23 with about 300 people in attendance that included a blessing ceremony and a fiesta with a mariachi band. Families began moving into the community soon after in February.





garden and soccer fields. “This is going to be a beautiful community where people can live with dignity,” he said.

“This new community will provide an opportunity for decent and affordable living for farm workers,” said Keith Keene, the Mayor of the City of Arcadia. “We welcome Casa San Juan Bosco to Arcadia.”

“What a marvelous example of cooperation between governments and faith based organizations,” said Rev. Jerome Carosella, Pastor of Our Lady of Mercy Parish. “So many people worked so hard for so long.” The Boca Grande parish paid for the community center with a \$500,000 donation. St. Thomas More Parish in Sarasota donated the computers for the computer lab and equipment for the soccer fields.

Representatives from United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), DeSoto County, City of Arcadia, Florida Housing Finance, Florida Nonprofit Housing, National Development, Brooks and Freund, the Diocese of Venice, the Florida Catholic Conference, and Gulf Citrus Growers were in attendance at the blessing ceremony.

Construction of Casa San Juan Bosco, named after St. John Bosco who is known for his legacy of service to the underprivileged, began in October 2011. The family-friendly neighborhood was built on a 29-acre lot in DeSoto County and features 16 four bedroom/two bath units and 37 three bedroom/two bath units, along with a 1,600 square-foot community center with a computer lab and offices for on-site personnel.

“Agribusiness is the largest industry in our state, other than tourism, and this housing project will allow hard-working farm worker families to remain together and live in safe, clean, and affordable housing,” Routsis-Arroyo said.

National Development of America LLC was the project developer and the homes were built by Brooks & Freund LLC. NDC Real Estate Management will manage the property.

Funding for the housing project was through the Florida Housing Finance Corporation and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). Forty-four of the homes will be eligible

for rental assistance through the USDA.

Bishop Frank Dewane of the Diocese of Venice credited the hard work of Catholic Charities staff, board members and volunteers along with private supporters, and for their perseverance in seeing the work completed. Bishop Dewane also was involved in moving the project successfully toward completion. In addition, Sister Cathy Buster, Sisters of Providence, and Sister Ann DeNicolo, Sisters of Charity, were instrumental in seeing their dream of a farm worker housing community in Arcadia convert to a reality.

Casa San Juan Bosco is an answer to a lack of affordable housing in DeSoto County. After Hurricane Charley destroyed a large portion of low-income homes in 2004, Catholic Charities set forth to provide decent homes for farm workers and their families.

“There was a need for quality, affordable housing prior to Hurricane Charley, but out of the devastation, this project was born,” Routsis-Arroyo said. “This is not just a housing complex, but a community.”


